Wood procurement policy

We commit that our round wood and sawn wood supplies come from forests where forestry practices meet the requirements of recognized forest certification standards such as FSC®, SFI® and CSA® Z809, or that this raw material does not originate from controversial sources such as:

- Illegally harvested forests;
- · Genetically modified trees;
- High conservation value forests threatened by forestry activities;
- Natural forest converted into plantations or non-forestry vocations;
- Territories where there is a breach of civil or traditional rights derived from laws, agreements or treaties recognized by the government authorities;
- Territories where there is violation of the ILO Conventions as defined in the ILO declaration on the fundamental principles and rights at work.

To do this, we intend to comply with all legal requirements and other requirements applicable to our wood procurement activities. We are committed to maintaining the necessary control measures to ensure our clients that the certified products they are buying do not contain wood from controversial sources.

In our activities, we commit to respect the requirements of the International Labour Organization on child and forced labour, not to impede freedom of association, to allow the right to collective bargaining and to maintain a non-discriminatory access in employment.

We are also committed to continuously improve the chain of custody of our wood procurement in order that our certified wood products always meet the most stringent environmental requirements.
